Dear Mr. Kubota:

Your letter of March 3 and the copy of the Japanese edition of INSIDE THE SPACE SHIPS have both reached me safely and I do thank you for your thoughtfulness. I sincerely hope that the information in this book receives much publicity and that the book is read, understood and put into practice throughout your nation and in Japanese colonies throughout the world. The Japanese people have a great heritage which I believe very few really know, but most of them feel within themselves.


I only wish it were possible for me to read, speak and understand every language spoken on Earth. It would not only be interesting, but decidedly advantageous in many ways. However, my knowledge in this respect is limited to the English language, with the exception of a little Polish and a very few words in Spanish.

Late last October I left California for Mexico in order to resume research without the many interruptions I have at home. Conditions at home, which I had left in the care of others, forced me to shorten my Mexican visit by a couple of months, and return home. However, while there I had a number of meetings with people from other worlds, including Neptune and Jupiter. Many people are living and working in Mexico and Guatemala for freedom of movement is greater there than in the States and a number of other countries. During these meetings I was given a suggestion for a plan which would enable me to meet the demands of the people. At present I am receiving mail from every part of the world. Each letter should be answered personally for all or most of the writers are sincere. But this is impossible at present both from the physical standpoint and the financial.

The suggestion was for a publication, periodically, which would be on a subscription basis. For countries whose people do not speak English, one person will be asked to take the responsibility of sharing this information with his countrymen. This plan has not yet been worked out in detail, but when it is, I shall let you know for I am sure you will be interested.

In the meantime may I wish you and your wife the best of everything.
