Dear Mr. Kubota:

Thank you sincerely for your letter of March 20th which reached me on the 28th. I am most grateful for your excellent cooperation, and the Brothers and I are depending much upon you and your countrymen as important factors in the world peace problem.

Today I am sending to you registered, by surface mail, a large package of correspondence and information which I believe you will find both interesting and useful as your countrymen come to you for information.

Little by little people of the world are awakening to the reality of what is taking place, especially since the coming of six thousand ships from neighboring planets moving through our atmosphere simultaneously last November. This was done for two purposes. Many people on Earth had said they would believe in the reality of space craft if they could see them and if they were seen simultaneously by the peoples of many nations. This was accomplished. Also, some government leaders were planning an attempt to discredit the whole thing by issuing a statement that all the unidentified flying objects which had been seen through the years were nothing more than experimental craft of certain Earth nations. But after the November event, they were unable to release such a statement.

Furthermore, during one of my most recent meetings with the space people, I was told that this program of friendship which you have already set in motion in Japan will be carrying on in cooperation with us, is having much more influence throughout the world than many people realize. As you can see by the list of names and addresses of our co-workers which is included with the literature and mail in the parcel, the people of thirteen nations are actively engaged in this program and as time passes I am sure other nations will join us.

I shall be delighted if you are able to give me the information which Mr. Back has. It is indeed a pleasure to me to know that you are familiar with Chinese, Korean, and Japanese languages. You will note in the parcel two letters I have written to Korean correspondents who, I fear, might have a very difficult time reading my English letters. They probably would find it as difficult to understand me as I found it to understand them, so far as the words are concerned. My replies to them are solely from a sense of feeling because I have been unable to have their scrolls translated as yet. However, I have kept them with a view to complete translation at a near-future date.

As for personally contacting the space Brothers - - I can make no promises for I haven't the right to do so. With the thousands of them now living on Earth, and with your interest in them already established, it is very likely that you have met some of them
