Dear Hachiro Kubota:

Thank you for your letter of July 21. I was delighted to receive and would have answered sooner but have been seeking answers for your questions that were more accurate than my knowledge, or would confirm my feelings on some of the subjects about which you asked. I am not wise, dear friend, but I have friends in whom I have great confidence who have more knowledge than I. But you can depend upon my friendship to you always remaining loyal. I too wish that we could be together to talk over many things. It seems sometimes hard to express with the written word that which we really want to say. When people can be together and talk, there is the added benefit of facial and tonal expressions to help with the words.

For your questions:

1. GA is not a saint! He is a very forceful man who has gained a great deal of wisdom and understanding as he has traveled along Life's pathway. Also he has had experiences which he has shared with the world to help his fellowmen. In doing so, he has helped old and binding theories, loosen the bonds that confined mankind to our little planet, and given him hope for a greater life of interest and travel through the cosmos, which he previously thought was an empty void. He has little formal education, but he has great courage which has enabled him to accomplish that which more educated men would not have dared to attempt.

2. He is not a drunkard. He does take a drink of liquor now and then, socially, but most people, especially in the U.S.A. do that. I find no fault with it and am sure you do not either.

3. If Matsumura is actually contacting physical human beings, I would say they are quite different from any GA has met. I have no knowledge of this type of visitors who seem to behave entirely differently from the normal conduct of our interplanetary neighbors. With your statement that they have forced telepathy upon him and seem to impress him with endangering his life from day to day, I would advise him to beware of them, whether they are from our world or another. From all I have been able to learn, I doubt that they are interplanetarians, and definitely not from Saturn. GA has met a number of people from Saturn and none of them would for a minute think of imposing their thoughts upon the mind of another man! They know, that as each of us must eat for ourselves, grow for ourselves, and learn for ourselves, we also must think for ourselves, learn to recognize and follow our inner guidance for ourselves and become masters of our own lives if we are to do the will of the Infinite One.

4. George Williamson has gone into the field of the psychic, which I will not support. He had no knowledge of this field before entering it, and in my opinion, it is very dangerous to ignorantly delve into such things. As a geologist, George W. might be very good. I don't know. I understand he is now lecturing on his scientific findings in South America. But all that I have heard from him, through reports of others, regarding the space visitors is false, so far as I have been able to learn through various investigations I have made. I have never taken time to read his books because the feel of them did not encourage me to waste my time on them. His interpretations of the footprints were completely erroneous. Yes, I think it is nonsense.

5. No! I do not believe the "THREE MEN IN BLACK" originate in Orion Constellation. I think entirely too much publicity is being given this particular incident, which, I honestly believe, are some of our own investigators who would like to instill fear into the minds of people to get them off the interest in space flight. The subject would die a normal death if the people would only let it. I believe it has been years since anything of that kind has taken place.

6. This kind of stuff and name giving originated in psychism, and spiritualistic mediums. The space travelers use no such language and names. I have had this point verified.

7. I believe the Stanford Brothers only claim to have seen a space ship. Thousands of people have done that, so it is not extraordinary. The other two you asked about I cannot support in any way. I simply do not believe any part of their stories.

8. In my opinion, No! From all that GA has been able to learn and tell me, even the space people with their advanced precision instruments are unable to tell the time, and place of natural events.
